

**Historic Address by H.S.H. Prince Zak Fawaz**  
**Proclamation of the Constitution, Dissolution of the Former Government, and Formation of the New Cabinet**

Ladies and Gentlemen,

This evening, I wished to address the Nation at a moment when an essential page of our modern history is being written. Zakistan is entering a new phase one of clarity, structure, and responsibility.

For several months, we have worked tirelessly to provide our State with a constitutional framework that is clear, modern, and lasting.

We have sought to build not a government of circumstance, but a State of principle founded on legality, neutrality, and dignity. Tonight, Zakistan crosses a decisive threshold in its institutional development, by building strong institutions free from arbitrariness and confusion capable of ensuring the continuity of public action and the stability of the nation. In this spirit of responsibility and lucidity, I solemnly proclaim the entry into force of the Constitution of the Principality of Zakistan.

This text, now promulgated and published in the Official Journal, defines the balance of powers, regulates the functions of the executive and the government, and establishes an order founded on legality and transparency.

It is a major milestone one that anchors our young State in institutional maturity and administrative discipline.

But even the most just text means nothing unless it is implemented. The implementation of law requires credible institutions, a coherent government, and clear direction. That is why, in accordance with Article 19 of the Constitution, I have decided today to dissolve the government formed on 17 September 2025.

This decision, carefully considered, had become necessary.

In recent weeks, troubling signs of inconsistency and a lack of rigor have weakened the coherence of governmental work. No government, whatever its composition, can endure without discipline, without method, and without respect for the authority of the State.

I do not take such decisions lightly.

But to govern is to decide firmly, when the higher interests of the State demand it.

And to preserve the continuity of institutional action, under the powers granted to me by Article 15 of the Constitution, I have decided, without delay and after consultation with the Prime Minister, to appoint a new princely government today tasked with implementing the Constitution and ensuring the stability and permanence of the State.

The Prime Minister, Mr. Joud El Arab, will bear the responsibility of leading the government's work with method and authority.

At his side, I appoint:

Mr. Tarek Abou Issa, Minister of State;

Mrs. Tala Fawaz, Keeper of the Seals, Minister of Justice;

Mr. Mohamed Emar, Minister of Foreign Affairs;

Mrs. Farah Moufarrej, Minister of Interior and Internal Security;

Mr. Thomas Francis, Minister of Energy and Infrastructure;

Mr. Zaki Ouazzani Chahdi, Minister of Economy and Finance;

Mr. Pierre Daccache, Minister of Information and Social Affairs.

This government is not a government of circumstance it is one of construction.

From its very first days, it will begin implementing an administrative restructuring plan designed to strengthen institutional stability, reinforce fiscal discipline, and establish a clear calendar of public action.

The Principality of Zakistan now stands as a responsible, neutral political entity, respectful of international law and guided by seriousness and integrity.

Our recognition will not be achieved through words, but through the consistency of our actions and the credibility of our governance.

On this 19th day of October 2025, the Principality of Zakistan enters History.

Our State is now fully constituted; our commitments are clear, and our course is steady.

History will remember this day as the one when Zakistan adopted its fundamental law, its constitutional government, and the full legitimacy of its action.

With calm, with lucidity, but with the quiet pride of those who build for the long term, I say this:

Zakistan is ready ready to act, ready to cooperate, and ready to endure.

Long live Peace, Unity, and Progress.

Long live Zakistan.
